...for a time is coming when all who are in their graves will hear his voice and come out—those who have done good will rise to live, and those who have done evil will rise to be condemned.

(John 5:28-29, NIV)

For whoever keeps the whole law and yet stumbles at just one point is guilty of breaking all of it.

(James 2:10, NIV)

For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out.

(Romans 7:18b, NIV)

We live by faith, not by sight.

(2 Corinthians 5:7, NIV)

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast. For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

(Ephesians 2:8-10, NIV)

All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them.

(2 Corinthians 5:18-19, NIV)

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.

His divine power has given us everything we need for life and godliness through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness.
